ATTENDANCE



We would like to make parents aware of some changes that we have made to our Attendance Policy.

From the week after the May half-term the following will apply:-

Children will be classed as late if they have not arrived by 8.45am which is when registers are closed. An unauthorised absence will be recorded if a child does not come in to school before 9.05am unless a reason is given (such as a medical appointment.) So, if a child arrives late at 9.20am the child will be recorded as having an unauthorised absence for that morning session.

We always monitor attendance and send letters out warning parents about poor attendance if their child has had more than four broken weeks in any 'long' term or if their attendance drops below 90%. If this continues then parents may be invited to school for a meeting with our Education Welfare Officer who will create an action plan to improve the child's attendance.

Generally attendance at Wellesley is very good but we have noticed that more children are having broken weeks which is a cause for concern. Taking a child away for a long weekend is very disruptive to their education as they miss the end of one week's unit of work (which is when they consolidate their learning); then they miss the beginning of another week's work (which means that they are catching up for the rest of the week).

We would really appreciate your support with trying to address this issue and would remind you that children should not be taking holidays in school term time unless in exceptional circumstances.

MEDICAL NEEDS

We have just adopted the Local Authority Medical Needs Policy. This states that school will not administer aspirin based products to any child unless prescribed by a doctor. This means we will no longer be able to give children products that contain ibruprofen. This will not stop us from giving products such as Calpol, which are paracetamol based, as long as we have written authorisation.

Please could we take this opportunity to remind parents that no child should bring any form of medicine into school to self-administer. We are happy to help with medication but do need written authorisation.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS

We would be really grateful if any parent who thinks that their child may be entitled to free school meals follows the link below and completes an application. It is a very simple system and school benefits financially if your child is eligible. It is important to note that parents of children in KS1, who already receive a free meal, still need to apply for the school to benefit.

Free School Meals - how to apply

Parents and carers can now apply for free school meals online via the Citizen Portal, using the link below. Your eligibility will be checked online, and the portal will let you know whether your child is eligible for free school meals. If your child is eligible you will receive a confirmation message, and the school will be notified directly. If you are not eligible you will be presented with a message stating this.

Please note, if you have already completed a primary or secondary school place application for the 2017/18 academic year via the portal, you do not need to re-register when applying for free school meals. Please use the login details that you have already set up.
