# **Parking**

For a long while now the parking problems outside of our school at the start and end of the school day have been difficult and complaints have been made about inconsiderate parking. As a result of this we joined the 'Three Strikes Scheme'. This gives you the ability to report inconsiderate parking to the local beat team. You need to record the registration of the vehicle, the reason you feel it is parked inconsiderately and the time and date on a signed incident slip and post it in a box in the entrance of the school. This information will be collected by the Police on a regular basis. They will then send the registered keeper a warning letter. If the same registration is reported a second time the owner would get a home visit from a PCSO or Police Officer. If it happens a third time and is witnessed by the Police first-hand they would consider issuing a ticket which would result in a fine and possibly points on the owner's licence.

Please note that he running of the scheme and any actions which arise from it are the sole responsibility of officers of the Avon & Somerset Police and not the school.

If you have any questions about the scheme please do not hesitate to contact us, either through the school or by calling the Police on their non-emergency number – 101.

We would ask that all parents show consideration to the local residents and each other at drop-off and pick-up time and park with care, avoiding putting our pupils at risk and not blocking driveways. Please also remember that the speed limit in Edgeworth is 20mph.

We would also ask that parents/carers to do not use enter the staff car parking area to drop off/pick up children.

# Anti-Bullying Behaviour

We would like to remind parents and carers of the importance of always informing us of any behaviour that is causing your child concern. If you have any worries we are always here to listen. We consider bullying to be 'any deliberate, hurtful, upsetting, frightening or threatening behaviour by an individual or a group towards other people, which results in worry, fear, pain or distress to the victim. It is repeated over a period of time'.
